MAJOR IN GLOBAL HEALTH

You must combine the global health major with any other major at Duke to create your one-of-a-kind education experience.

Major requirements:

- 3 core courses
- 3 foundation courses
- 3 focused study courses
- 1 senior seminar
- 1 statistics course
- 1 experiential activity

MINOR IN GLOBAL HEALTH

Minor requirements:

- 2 core courses
 - Fundamentals of Global Health
 - A course in Global Health Ethics
- 3 Electives

Cross-listed courses and up to 2 transfer credits are acceptable. Courses taken satisfactory/unsatisfactory and Advanced Placement credits do not count toward the minor.

DGHI Student Research Training Program (SRT)

The DGHI Student Research Training Program is an intensive experiential learning program that engages second and third year undergraduate students in the development, implementation and assessment of a community-based project.

Who can apply?

- Second and third year undergraduate students at Duke who have demonstrated a significant interest in global health through coursework
- Previous international or community-based project experience is desirable

Requirements

Students are expected to make a significant commitment to preparing for their experience. This includes readings and background research, as well as attending:

- Bi-weekly meetings with faculty directors
- Pre-departure workshops focused on project development and implementation
- Post-fieldwork workshops focused on reentry and processing the experience
